GOAL:

Participants will gain knowledge of prevention techniques that will enhance the ability of community-based organizations to design, develop, implement and evaluate effective HIV prevention interventions for persons who are living with HIV.



COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides an overview of HIV prevention with positives including key elements of program development specific to HIV-positive persons.
