

## How can capacity-building assistance (CBA) help you better serve your community?

- ◆ Through stronger community-based organizations, health departments and health department-funded community-based organizations representative of African-American youths in science-based prevention efforts against HIV disease.
- ◆ Through community-based organizations, health departments and health department-funded community-based organizations that can deliver the highest quality services possible while maintaining efficient overall operations.
- ◆ Through behavioral science and intervention effectiveness which are essential elements in building the capacity of organizations to lead the fight against HIV disease.
- ◆ Through community mobilization and planning
- ◆ Through building relationships with your Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) project officer
- ◆ Through improving an organization's chances for success and sustainability

## How can capacity-building assistance services be requested?

- ◆ CDC-funded organizations and health departments enter your request into the Capacity-building Assistance Information Request System at: [www.cdc.gov/hiv/cba](http://www.cdc.gov/hiv/cba).
- ◆ Your project officer will review and comment on the request.
- ◆ If your project officer approves the request, it will be assigned to the appropriate CBA provider(s).
- ◆ The CBA provider will contact your organization directly to assess your needs and then take action to meet your needs.
- ◆ Health department-funded organizations funded through other means contact your local health department and ask that your request be entered into the Capacity-building Assistance Information Request System at: [www.cdc.gov/hiv/cba](http://www.cdc.gov/hiv/cba).

## Who will deliver capacity-building assistance services?

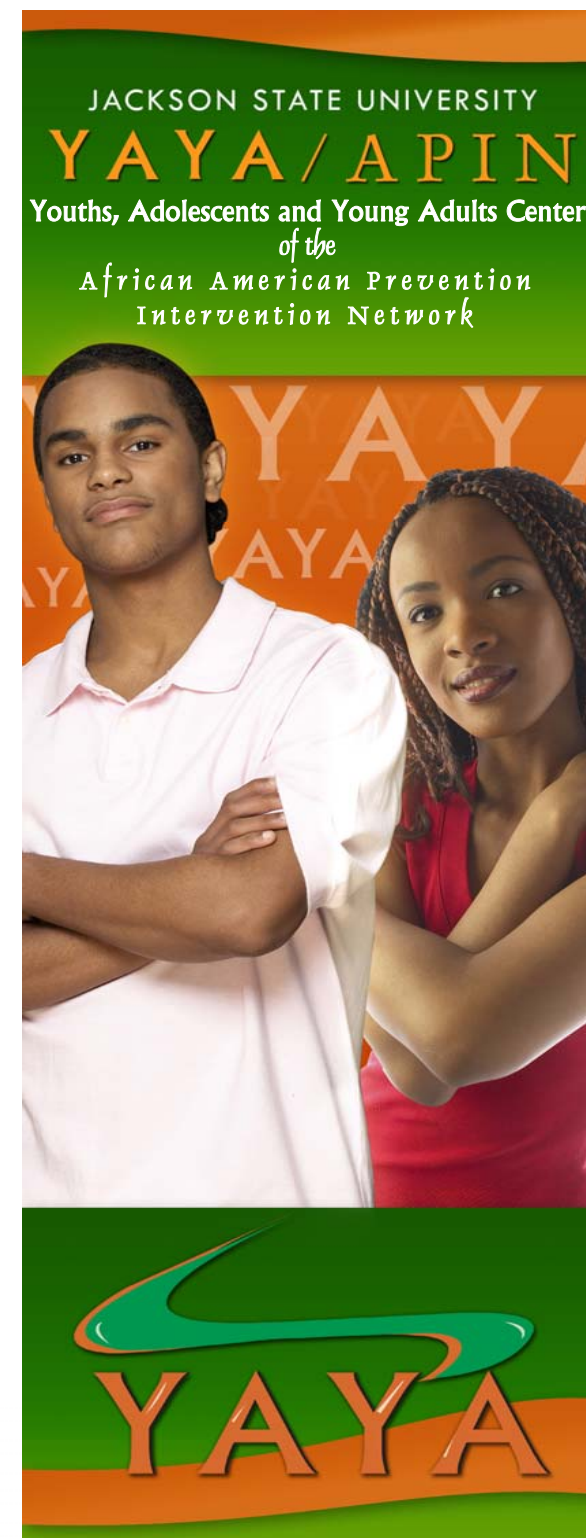
- ◆ Experts who are skilled in the application of behavioral science methods
- ◆ Experts from other agencies, including health departments, and individuals within your geographical region who are familiar with the area on an organizational, scientific, epidemic and resource basis.
- ◆ Providers who will work with you on prevention intervention efforts
- ◆ Peer consultants, behavioral scientists, program managers or administrators with specific knowledge and proven experience to help you achieve your CBA needs.

### What type of capacity-building assistance can you expect?

- ◆ Information Transfer – Collecting, packaging and disseminating data through newsletters, reports, announcements, list serves, batchTraining activities customized for staff, board members, trainers, volunteers, community members and opinion leaders to build faxes and a Web site.
- ◆ Skills-building – skills and competence.
- ◆ Technical Consultation – Providing expert advice to key personnel on how to accomplish a task or series of tasks via written documents, faxes, telephone, e-mail or on-site presentations with the intent that the tasks will be carried out by the recipient of the advice.
- ◆ Technical Services – Implementing tasks on-site using a variety of delivery mechanisms to assist an organization in coalition-building, network maintenance, community mobilization, community planning, etc. in a competent and skillful manner.
- ◆ Technology Transfer – Using products, methodologies or techniques either already in existence or newly-developed to provide skills-building, technical consultation or technical services.

## Youths, Adolescents and Young Adults Center of the African American Prevention Intervention Network

### Focus

The Youths, Adolescents and Young Adults Center of the African American Prevention Intervention Network (YAYA/APIN) is a project designed to assist community-based organizations (CBOs) in the United States of America and its territories with adaptation, implementation, quality assurance and evaluation of effective HIV prevention interventions for high-risk seronegative and HIV-positive racial/ethnic minority individuals. The YAYA/APIN builds capacity among African-American youth-serving community-based organizations, health departments and health department-funded community-based organizations through a variety of delivery mechanisms including: information transfer, skills-building, technical services, technical consultation and technology transfer.

The YAYA/APIN is administered by Jackson State University's Mississippi Urban Research Center. Input is received via a national advisory board. Capacity-building assistance services in a variety of areas are delivered by an expert staff.
